Finalising Transfer Reviews for existing statements of SEN

By 1 April 2018, local authorities must have transferred all children and young people with statements of SEN and who are eligible for an Education, Health and Care plan to the new SEND system. As we get closer to the final deadline to finalise Transfer Reviews for existing statements, all local authorities will be asked to provide information on progress, on a monthly basis from April 2017 until the end of the transitional period.

This information will help the Department for Education (DfE) to assess progress, including how close we are to hitting targets and whether all statements will be transferred under the new system by the deadline.

The monthly data collection will include just two questions, which will remain the same for each month of the collection:

- How many transfers of SEN statements have yet to be completed?
- Of those remaining, how many does the LA expect to complete by 31 March 2018?

Information provided will be treated in confidence and is intended for internal use within the Department for Education, data will only be shared with contracted partners in order to be able to best target support.

In partnership with NSPCC, we are offering a FREE session on how you can keep your child safe online.

Innocent searches sometimes reveal not so innocent results. Parental controls can be used to block upsetting or harmful content, control in-app purchases or manage how long your child spends online. And the good news is parental controls are really easy to set up.

It's simple to get started. Along with talking to your child regularly, using parental controls is one of the best ways to help keep children safe online.
